Electives (18 credits):

Students are required to take an additional six courses, of which at least three must be at the 300-level.

With the Undergraduate Director's approval, students may replace up to two electives with courses that are offered by other departments or units of Rutgers University. Credit may be offered for one course in Spanish language or composition at the 200-or 300-level. Only one independent study course may be used to satisfy the requirements, except by students enrolled in the department's honors program.
