Puerto Rico: After the Hurricane (Fall 2018)

In September 2017 Hurricane Maria ripped across the island of Puerto Rico, leaving death and destruction in its path. In this seminar students will form a research team to examine the current humanitarian, environmental, human rights, and financial crises afflicting Puerto Rico as well as its recovery and resiliency. The final product for the class will be a group multi-media project featuring the work of the team.

For the first part of the seminar we will meet to discuss common readings, create a shared bibliography, and develop a research plan. Guided by individual strengths and interests, while still forming part of a structured group project, students will work on a larger interdisciplinary multi-media project incorporating history, literature, music, and art. Students will learn how to organize a research project, conduct library and web-based research, analyze primary and secondary sources, and share their findings with a broad audience through a digital platform.
